Focus Groups

Additionally, parents and students were invited to provide feedback and engage in discussion around bettering our programs and supports for students.

An **Online Survey** was administered at the conclusion of each Focus Group Meeting as well as distributed to parents in a variety of ways throughout the Focus Group period. Through these surveys parents were again invited to provide feedback around bettering our programs and supports for students, particularly focusing on school climate and Career and Technical Education (CTE).

Parent Survey Results

95%

of parents feel they are either satisfied or most satisfied with their experience at OFL.

99%

of parents are either somewhat likely or very likely to refer a friend or family member to our school.

98%

of parents are either somewhat likely or very likely to stay enrolled at OFL for the next 12 months or until graduation.

92%

of parents either agree or strongly agree that OFL has enough programs that develop students' social emotional skills.

83%

of parents either agree or strongly agree that they belong at OFL.

Identified Strengths



When asked about specific areas that contribute to OFL school climate such as discipline, safety, and social-connectedness, parents indicated that their concerns on these areas significantly decreased after enrolling at OFL.

Parents ranked the following Career & Technical Education (CTE) pathways as their top choices:

Development



The Career & Technical Education (CTE) program is currently being developed at OFL. This includes the selection of CTE pathways, the hiring and training of teachers, as well as the development of curriculum and external partnerships. All input on pathways and course offerings are being strongly considered in program development.

When asked about plans after graduation, parents ranked the following as their top choices for their students:

Community college

Trade school

OFL is currently developing an Early College program that will allow for dual enrollment in courses that students can receive college credit for while in high school.

OFL is currently developing a partnership with Pathways College that will aid students in gaining access to an affordable 4 year degree.

The development of the CTE program will provide students with preliminary skills necessary for pursuing trade options after high school.

When asked what career field students are most likely to pursue, parents ranked the following as their top choices:

Art/design
Nursing/medical
Music/film/entertainment
Law/criminology
Computers/information technology

Career interests will be strongly considered in the development of the CTE program and its pathways, as well as in elective course development.
